The initial meeting to organize a state chapter of the Registry of Interpreters for the Deaf was held at the Domino Restaurant, College Park, Md., on March 13, 1971, under the chairmanship of Alexander Fleischman, The arrangements were under the sponsorship of the Maryland Association of the Deaf.

The meeting was called to order at 2:20 PM with Mr. Fleischman presiding, Setting forth an agenda along with a R.I.D. model constitution to be acted on, The chairman introduced Mr. Earl Stevens, president of the Maryland Association of the Deaf, who spoke that such a chapter was necessary and after two attempts in the past to set up a meeting he asked Mr. Fleischman to promote the undertaking. Sheldon A. Blumenthal was appointed secretary pro tem.

Chairman Fleischman requested that each person present should introduce himself and his professional connections.

As the first step of the agenda, the question of whether or not to organize the chapter was posed. After some discussion, Thomas Cuscaden proposed that we should form a chapter, seconded by John Hook, It was unanimously carried.

Sheldon Blumenthal (Mrs. James) proposed that this chapter be named as Maryland Registry of Interpreters. This was unanimously passed.

Adoption of the model constitution was the next step on the agenda. With modifications coming from the floor, the constitution was accepted with the following changes:

 Article I -- Mr. Arthur Norris (Mrs. Lewis) proposed that we should accept membership from adjoining District of Columbia and Northern Virginia. Passed unanimously.

Articles II, III, IV -- favorable

 Article V -- Mr. Earl Stevens offered to have the M.A.D. take care of the expenses for the first year which was gratefully accepted. The question of dues would be brought up at a future meeting.

Article VI -- Mr. Norris (Mrs. Wait) proposed that the whole article be abolished. Passed unanimously.

Article VII -- favorable

Renumbering will follow on Articles: VII to VI; VIII to VII; IX to VIII.

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[March 13, 1971 -- page 2] Bylaws: Article I, sections 1, 2, 3 -- favorable section 4 --- Mr. Norris (Mrs. Gibson) moved to substitute: "any two of three signature are required to sign checks." Approved. sections 5 & 6 --- insert word Executive prior to the word Board. Article II, section 1 --- Howard Watson (J. Hook) proposed that 60 days notice of meetings be substituted for 30 days as specified in the section. Passed. sections 2, 3 -- favorable. There is no Article II so the following articles should be renumbered accordingly Article IV (III), section 1 -- Alfred Sonnenstrahl (Ar. Watson) proposed that no more than four members shall be deaf or hearing. Rev. Pokorny (Mrs. James) moved to table this proposal and for the president to appoint a committee of three to write up a proposal for the next meeting. Approved. Article V (IV) -- There being a mention of two vice presidents in this section, Mrs. Virginia Lewis (Virginia Borggaard) moved to delete one which was accepted. Mrs. Lewis (Mr. Sonnenstrahl) proposed that the officers be elected annually with directors being on 3-2-1 year basis. Failed to carry. Mr. Donald Leitch (Rev. Smith) moved that they be elected every two years. Passed Mr. Sonnenstrahl moved that the Vice President automatically be President-Elect. Rev. Pokorny seconded. Passed. Article VI (V), section 1 -- Mr. William Zerwick (Tom Cuscaden) moved to delete the phrase "regardless of race, creed or ethnic origin" from the section. Failed. sections 2, 3 -- favorable Article VII (Vi), Article VIII (VII) -- favorable. by laws as a whole except the tabled ones. Passed.

Sheldon Blumenthal (Mr. Stevens) moved to accept the revised constitution and

Mr. Leitch (Mr. Hook) proposed that Md. R.I.D. be affiliated with the M.A.D. Passed.

Immediately thereafter, Mr. Fleischman swore in the elected officers and turned the chair over to Rev. Pokorny.

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned.
